

## TML 2022 Legislative Agenda Update

SB149/HB170 TACIR reporting - impact of the Competitive Wireless Broadband Investment,

Deployment, and Safety Act.

Sponsors Sen. Briggs, Richard; Rep. Zachary, Jason

Category Utilities

Summary Deletes provision that requires TACIR to report to the chairs of the commerce committee

of the house of representatives and commerce and labor committee of the senate by January 1, 2021, on the impact of the Competitive Wireless Broadband Investment, Deployment, and Safety Act of 2018 after the report is given. Broadly captioned.

Amendment Senate Commerce & Labor Committee amendment 1, House amendment 1 (013242) increases the maximum threshold of various fees which may be assessed by local

authorities for the deployment of small wireless facilities (SWF) within rights-of-way (ROW). Makes various changes to the defined size of SWFs and potential support structures (PSS) for SWFs. Specifies that certain sections of the proposed legislation do not apply to a small cell installed prior to the effective date of the act, unless and until the

small cell is physically modified.

SB971/HB1029 Public meetings - electronic communication via Internet forum.

Sponsors Sen. Walley, Page; Rep. Moon, Jerome

Category Public Employees

Summary Extends the amount of time that a governing body that permits electronic communication

between members over the internet must maintain a public archive of the communication

from one year to two years. Broadly captioned.

Amendment Senate State & Local Government Committee amendment 1 (007160) deletes all

Summary language after the enacting clause. Authorizes governing bodies to meet and conduct all

necessary business by any electronic means, under certain circumstances until February

1, 2022, or 30 days after the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention lifts the

recommendations related to large gatherings.

SB1314/HB1450 Imposing of a public safety surcharge.

Sponsors Sen. Hensley, Joey; Rep. Doggett, Clay

Category Local Government

Summary Allows municipalities, counties and metro governments to impose a public safety

surcharge for providing public safety services upon the adoption of a resolution in the entity's legislative body. Requires that funds generated by the surcharge be separated



from the general fund and used to fund public safety services. Establishes regulations for

adopting and changing the surcharge.

SB1985/HB2039 Funding scholarships for certified municipal finance officers.

Sponsors Sen. Jackson, Ed; Rep. Carr, Dale

Category Local Government

Summary Creates the certified municipal finance officer endowment fund within the state treasury

to provide funding to municipalities for the certification and continuing education costs associated with the certified municipal finance officer program. Subject to endowment fund availability, directs the comptroller of the treasury to provide the sponsoring municipality a \$1000 one-time stipend and reimbursement of qualifying training and travel expenses incurred by the candidate, not to exceed \$1300. Allows the comptroller to reimburse, up to \$400 annually, a municipality for continuing professional education

for each certified municipal finance officer employed by or contracting with the municipality. Stipulates that the program should consist of funds appropriated by the

general assembly, grants and federal funds.

SB2076/HB2012 Distribution of state sales and use tax revenues.

Sponsors Sen. Briggs, Richard; Rep. Carr, Dale

Category Taxes Sales

Summary Reduces, from 29.0141 percent to 28.5262 percent, the share of state sales and use tax

revenue deposited to the state general fund. Increases, from 4.6030 percent to 5.0909

percent, the share appropriated to municipalities.

SB2469/HB2562 Local option sales tax on single articles in excess of \$1,600.

Sponsors Sen. Powers, Bill; Rep. Hicks, Gary

Category Taxes Sales

Summary Deletes the additional state tax of 2.75 percent applied to the amount of single articles in

excess of \$1,600 but less than or equal to \$3,200. Authorizes local governments to

impose a local tax up to 2.75 percent on such amount.

Fiscal Note (Dated March 3, 2022) Decrease State Revenue Net Impact \$83,467,400/FY22-23 and

Subsequent Years Increase Local Revenue \$75,859,100/FY22-23 and Subsequent Years

House Status 02/08/22 - Referred to House Finance, Ways & Means Subcommittee.

SB2564/HB1949 Compensation of officials in cities with general law modified manager-council

charters.

Sponsors Sen. Crowe, Rusty; Rep. Darby, Tandy

Category Local Government

Summary Authorizes the council of a municipality with a modified city manager-council charter

to, upon the adoption of an ordinance by a 2/3 vote of the entire membership of the council, fix the salaries of the mayor and the members of the council annually at the time

the operating budget is adopted.

Fiscal Note (Dated February 16, 2022) Other Fiscal Impact Due to multiple unknown variables, the

extent and timing of any permissive increase in local expenditures cannot be reasonably

determined.
