Dear Local Government and Local Government Entity Officials,

Using the input we received from over 200 local government representatives who participated in our regional meetings held across Tennessee last fall, and in consultation with pension planning experts at the state's financial advisor, Public Financial Management, we have formulated and presented to the general assembly the Treasury Department's proposed new retirement options for local government entities.

I stress that nothing in these proposals affect state employees, K-12 Teachers or Higher Education employees. They do not affect any current retiree of the TCRS. They are optional for local governments and they do not force any local government to change anything. They also would only apply to new hires after the proposed effective date of July 1, 2012, and only for those local governments that elect to adopt them.
